[A Brief Look At Creating A Website](#)

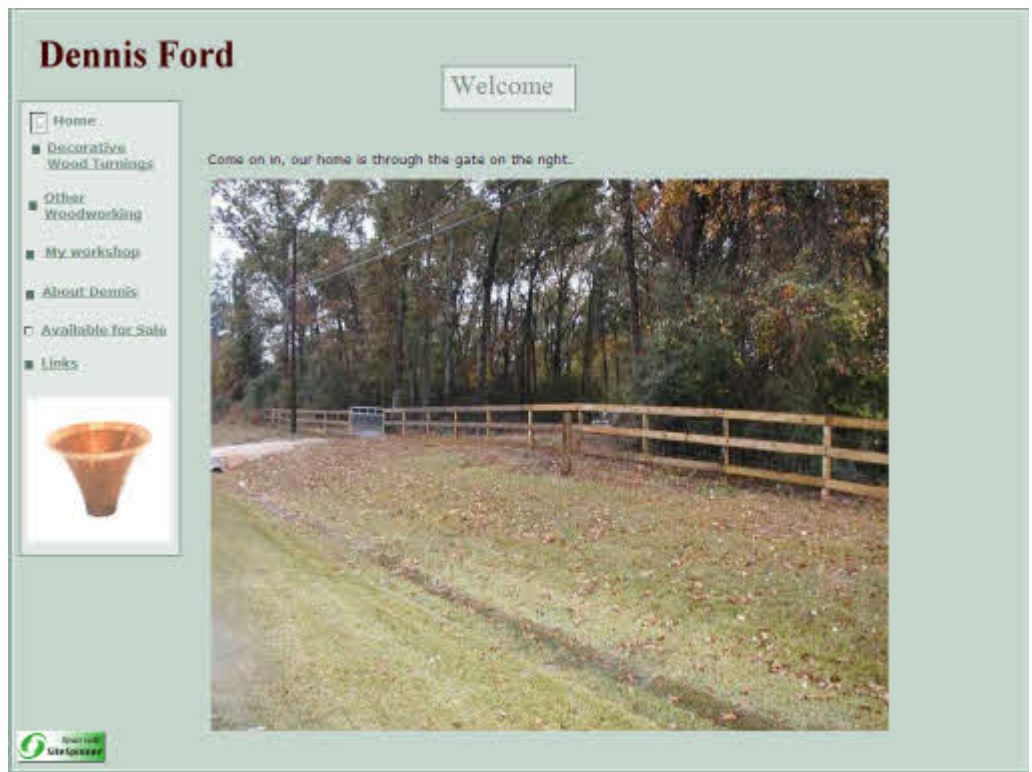


For some time I had considered putting up a web site to show my

woodwork but I did not want to spend a lot of time learning HTML code. After hearing a few more times that I should have a web site, I became interested again. I learned that you don't have to know HTML to build a web site, there is software available that does the coding for you. After doing only a small amount of research, I downloaded a free trial of "*Site Spinner*" software from www.VirtualMechanics.com.

After trying this software for a few hours, I purchased the license (\$49.00). I used this software to build my web site; <http://denniswoodart.com>.

Between work, holiday travel and shop time there has been limited time for work on my web site and the site shows a lack of polish, in spite of that, I have received several compliments. Having used only this one software for building a web site, I can not compare "*Site Spinner*" with other software offerings. I can recommend "*Site Spinner*" for those who are comfortable with computers but do not know HTML. – **Dennis Ford**

[BACK TO BASICS WITH JIMMY CLEWES](#)

This is exactly what it says, BASICS. It starts with what is a lathe and goes on from there to finished projects. It covers health and safety, lathes, chucks, tools, sharpening, abrasives and finishes. Jimmy does his usual great job explaining everything and shows how to turn a bowl, candlestick and pen.

A great DVD for the very new turner and those that never got a good start on turning.

[TURING THE WORLD WITH JIMMY CLEWES](#)

This is a 3 DVD set. Jimmy travels and turns in Norway, Scotland and Nevada.

- **Vol. 1** - In Norway Jimmy demonstrates turning a wooden spoon and a Norwegian Beer Bowl. Some of you may want to try this one, even if someone else turns it.
- **Vol. 2** - In Scotland Jimmy turns a Celtic shield wall hanging. I found this very interesting and will probably try one. He also turns a traditional

spurtle, a stick for stirring porridge. He shows a different way of shaping a skew. I tried it and it works as well as the traditional method, but I did not see any advantage. There is also a look at a modified pole lathe.

- **Vol. 3** - Jimmy goes to Nevada to make a wooden Bangle bracelet with silver inserts. This would make a nice gift. He also shows how to turn a southwest bowl with turquoise inlay. There is a visit to a Native American gallery to discuss form and shape.

As usual these are a great DVD full of lots of information and clear descriptions of what is happening. However since these are shot on locations and not in a studio, the quality of the video images are not always up to the quality of his studio work. The exception is the southwest bowl that is done in a studio.

We will have a limit of one of these DVD's per checkout so that more people can see them.

Another change to the newsletter will be in the way it is published on the club website in the future. In the past the newsletter has been published in two versions; a HTML version that can be viewed directly on the website using any Internet browser, and a "pdf" version that can only be viewed using a "pdf" viewer such as [Adobe Reader](#) or [Foxit Reader](#).

Without giving you a lot of jibberish about the newsletter creation process, the bottom line is the "pdf" format is easier to create and more accommodating of the various types of equipment our membership uses to view or print the newsletter. It is also more secure than the HTML version in that Internet "bots" can't mine the newsletter for email addresses to use for spamming. Therefore, beginning with the **January** edition of *The Turning Times*, the "pdf"

version will be the only version published for the website. If you don't have a "pdf" viewer on your computer, you can get one by clicking on one of the links below. These viewers are widely used on the Internet and you will undoubtedly find other uses for them in the future.

As always, I welcome any constructive comments regarding the newsletter and I am always appreciative of submissions from the membership. You are the newsletter staff and I encourage you to participate.
