The wood turners of North Texas will be hosting Nick Cook as their Annual Spring Demonstrator/Instructor. He will be in Fort Worth for an all-day demonstration on Saturday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> and the rest of the time he will be teaching hands-on classes on April 21, 23-25<sup>th</sup>. The all-day demo will be held at the R. D. Evans Community Center at 3200 Lackland Road, Fort Worth, TX 76116 (Mapsco page 74, Grid 3). The cost for the demonstration is \$10. and club membership is not required. The hands-on sessions will be \$75. Per day. Classes will be conducted at Stormy Boudreaux’s shop and at Woodcraft/Fort Worth.

The hands-on class curriculum will be based on the interests of the individual members of the class. Nick is probably one of the most versatile turner/instructors in the USA and will teach to your individual needs. ## The 15<sup>th</sup> Annual SW Association of Turners (SWAT) Woodturning Symposium

It is time to start making plans to attend the 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Southwest Association of Turners (SWAT) Woodturning Symposium, to be held in Temple, Texas, on September 29 and 30 and October 1. This Texas and southwestern tradition is the second largest woodturning symposium in the United States. The symposium is sponsored by the AAW chapters in Texas and Oklahoma, and has drawn 500 plus attendees in each of the last two years. The event this year will be under the leadership of President Walter Tate and the Board members representing each of the sponsoring clubs.

The SWAT Symposium is a great opportunity to try the symposium experience at a significantly lower cost than the AAW national symposium. The national lead demonstrators for 2006 are Dave Hout (metal spinning and basic bowl turning). Andre Martel (hook tool and hollow forms). Andi Wolfe (pyrography and multi-layer coupling) and David Nittman (Native American basket design). Although they haven’t been named yet, there will also be a regional lead demonstrator and a large number of regional demonstrators. As with last year, there will also be a separate demonstration room devoted strictly to pen turners.

There will, of course, be an Instant Gallery and many vendors. The Instant Gallery will give you a chance to show off some of your best work and see what other turners are doing. The vendor’s room will give you a chance to get to know the folks that you only normally deal with through catalogues and their web sites. Plus, this is a chance to see and try out (and, yes, buy) some of the toys that you have been wishing for.

Another highlight of the annual SWAT Symposium is the two-for-One Raffle. Your raffle tickets go into a bin to be drawn at the banquet on Saturday night for an excellent piece of woodturning art. Winners’ tickets then go back into the bin and are eligible to win tools, wood and other goodies at lunch on Sunday. Such a deal!

Joanie Genender is hard at work planning another Ladies Program. These activities, including tours, shopping and a Ladies Gallery, have greatly enhanced the event for the spouses who now have a chance to visit and get to know one another. As she has in the last two years, Joanie is planning a dinner and entertainment for couples on Friday evening.

## Tips For Tools

“When turning our grinder off, to keep from having to wait for many many seconds for it to stop, try using that “Sandpaper Cleaner” to stop it. You know the one that is made of rubber. If you don't have one, use an old tennis shoe!”

“We all need our grinders for sharpening out tools. Most of us also use the grinders for other things. Be careful! Do NOT use your grinder to grind aluminum or other non-ferrous metals. Aluminum is the worst as its residue can get mixed in with ferrous metal (tool steel) shavings and cause a fire! Also, non-ferrous metals get mixed into the grit of the wheel then can expand and cause the wheel to crack. These are real problems, so please be careful. Use a sander on non-ferrous metals and save the grinder for your tools.”
