### Trip Report

Paul Coppinger and I recently took a week-long platter turning class from Frank Penta at the John C. Campbell Folk School in North Carolina. Frank, the main instructor, was assisted by Alan Leland, a very accomplished turner in his own right. During the class we learned several approaches to turning large platters, including multiple kinds of bases, rims, and shapes. We also experimented with texturing and coloring our platters. In addition to turning platters we learned the advantages to various grinds on bowl and spindle gouges, and were shown specific methods for creating these grinds. We also made miniature hollowing tools, three-point tools, small skewers chisels and parting tools. There were even a few people who tried multi-axis spindle turning like Frank uses in making his famous birdhouses and boxes.

The Campbell Folk School is a wonderful environment in which to learn. The school provides excellent accommodations, three balanced meals a day, along with extracurricular activities to give you a break from your studies. The facilities are located in a farm setting in the lower end of the Appalachian mountain range. The campus is beautifully landscaped and covered with scenic walking paths and serene gardens where you can forget or remember anything you wish. The curriculum includes a multitude of craft-oriented courses, and each discipline has its own studio and resources. The Willard Baxter Woodturning studio is brand-new and is well outfitted with just about everything a turner could want. Paul and I both highly recommend the school and hope to return in the future.

Frank Penta is the demonstrator for the club's June meeting, I am confident when I say the club is in for a real educational treat. Those lucky enough to be signed up for his one-day hands-on training sessions just prior to the June meeting will get a double treat.

## Highlights from the May 2, 2007 Steering Committee Meeting

Items that were discussed, voted on and carried on May 2, 2007.

- Ken presented some thoughts and asked for additional ideas regarding the “Empty Bowls” project. This is the service project in which ETW will participate in 2007 into 2008. How to generate “more enthusiasm” from club members is the question. Perhaps club members, themselves, have some ideas. If so, send them to Ken. **Keep in mind that we agreed to contribute 300 “turned items” for the project and that equates to only four (4) items per member.**
- Since ETW has a reputation for its continuing education programs, one idea presented to the S/C was the notion of a scholarship in the amount of \$400.00, to be awarded to a member of ETW to assist the recipient in attending a school similar to the Campbell Folk School. The \$400.00 will be awarded from existing ETW funds. This was voted on and passed. Any member of ETW may apply for the stipend, the guidelines of which are to be established by a committee headed by Ken Terrell.
- In addition, another scholarship in the amount of \$100.00 will be awarded to an ETW member for the purpose of attending a local “club sponsored” class such as that to be presented in June by Frank Penta.
- The QUARTERLY raffle item in JUNE will be a \$125.00 stipend with the money being used to help the recipient with expenses for attendance at the fall SWAT meeting.
- A note regarding the Frank Penta presentation at the JUNE meeting. His demonstration will continue through the lunch hour. If you need to have a lunch bring a “BROWN BAG”.

The Steering Committee has approved a scholarship program Basically we will have available on a competitive basis two scholarships, one for a club classes such as the Penta class and one for \$400.00 for schools such as Arrowmont, etc. Details to follow after we get them developed.
